## INTRODUCTION

You are invited to join the MPPN for a focused study day designed to empower primary care staff with the essential tools, knowledge, and practical insights to conduct structured medication reviews (SMRs). Our panel of expert speakers will cover critical aspects of medicines optimisation, how to involve patients in the decision-making process, reducing patients' risk of harm from medicines and improving value for local health systems.

Overprescribing is the use of a medicine where there is a better non-medicine alternative, or where its use is inappropriate for that patient's circumstances or inconsistent with their wishes. This can lead to problematic polypharmacy where a patient's medicines are no longer clinically indicated, appropriate or optimised for that person, or they are receiving a combination of multiple medicines with the potential to cause harm to the person. Structured medication reviews (SMRs) enable a comprehensive and clinical review of a patient's medicines and detailed aspects of their health. Reviews are facilitated by shared decision-making conversations with patients around whether medicines are safe, effective and personalised to their needs and current situation.

This workshop will support practitioners working in PCNs that are required to improve medicines optimisation and implement SMRs for at risk cohorts. Discussion will focus on medicines optimisation strategies for reducing polypharmacy, minimising risk of prescribing harm, reducing over-prescribing and managing the risk of dependency on prescription drugs.
